And we know full well that this does not take free will away.

It is so easy to fall into the traps of this world and think that terrifying things can produce all sorts of troubles. But, not one of them is able to separate the Christian from the love of God which is in Jesus Christ, Lord of every terror and Master of every world. Then, of what shall we be afraid?

#### **NEW ORGANIST HIRED AT HOLIDAY HILLS.**

Mrs. Jan Crouch, a retired educator, has been hired as the new organist here. She remembers going to organ lesson with her Mom when her mother was the church organist for their church for more than thirty years. Jan never took any organ lessons because she wanted to learn to play church music "evangelistic style" and that took special training when she was a senior in high school. She took one year of Hammond Organ Lessons in college. (A Hammond Organs set up differently than a Rogers or Allen Church Organ.) Jan has played the piano

for church services, accompanied South Gospel quartets, Ladies' Trios, choirs and various other groups since 1959. After moving to Fairfield Bay in 2006, she served as pianist for Fairfield United Methodist Church until her husband was suddenly disabled seven years ago. As full-time caregiver, time did not allow for that position to continue.

When approached about the organ position available at Holiday Hills last October, she agreed to play "on a trial basics", to see if she could play their Rogers Church Organ. With the help of Ms. Norma, the church pianist, Wayne Weatherford; the sound & AV technician, and tutoring with You Tube, Jan is now playing for Sunday and other special services. "I love the way the congregation, Pastor Dan, and the choir have encouraged me. They especially love to hear the chimes on special hymns. Learning to play the organ again has been great for therapy for me. I am enjoying hymn arrangements I did way back in the 60's. It keeps my brain active. That's good!"
